Through the support of the YWCA of Greater Lawrence and the Women's Leadership Network at Alcatel-Lucent, the Susan L. King Scholarship Committee awards one \$3,000 scholarship each year. To qualify for the Susan L. King Scholarship, the applicant must be a **female and have been accepted as a first-year student at an accredited college or university in an Engineering or Science related curriculum**. "Core" sciences such as biology, chemistry, physics, and mathematics qualify. Allied health majors such as physical therapy, occupational therapy, nursing, respiratory therapy, pharmacy, and radiation therapy **DO NOT** qualify. Mental health majors including psychology, social work, and psychiatry **DO NOT** qualify.

The award will be based on:

- Scholastic Ability
- Character
- Activities

Scholarship awards shall be granted to properly qualified students regardless of race, creed, or national origin.

No award shall be made if, in the opinion of the Scholarship Committee, no applicant is properly qualified.

Consideration shall be given only to degree granting colleges approved by the Scholarship Committee and accredited by the State Board of Education of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts or by corresponding agencies of other states.
